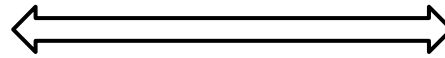
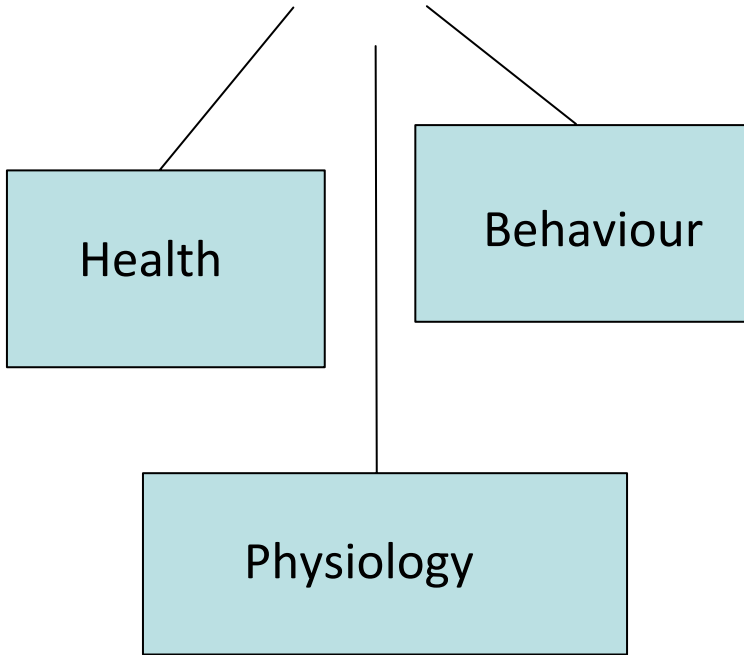

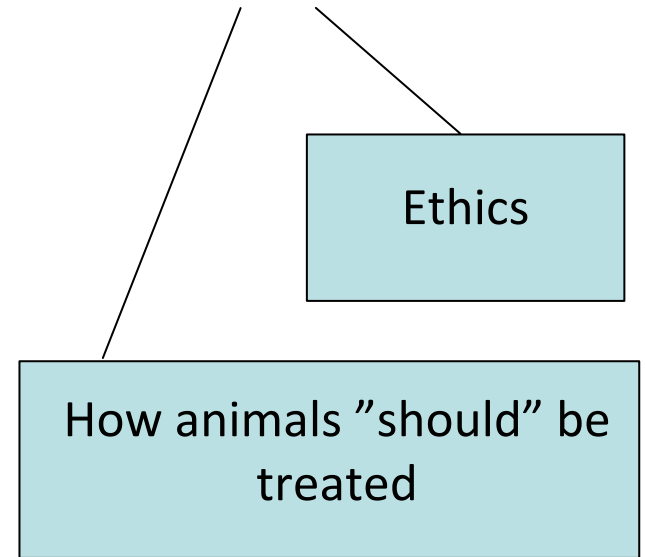
The word 'education' conjures up different images for different people



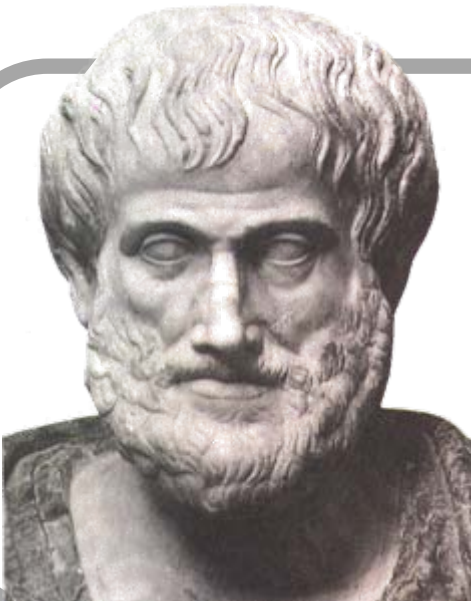

A good education does not tell people what to think, but aims to give them the knowledge to think for themselves



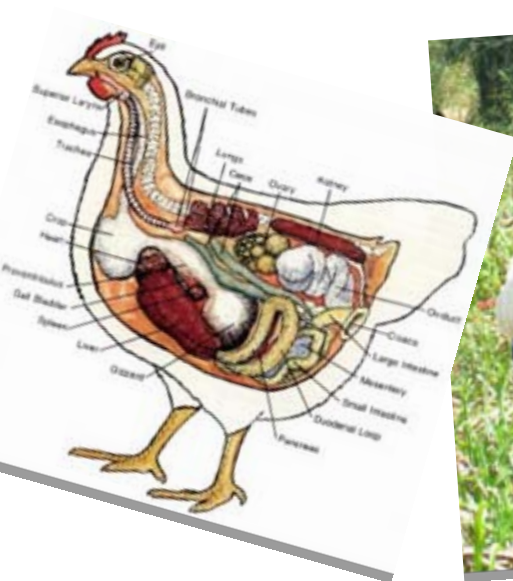
